Guidelines and Procedures:

General information:

- We will follow all guidelines and procedures recommended by the CDC, the State of Georgia, the Chattahoochee Council, and all municipalities within our council.
- All units will be expected to follow the procedures and guidelines outlined to ensure a safe and successful experience for all involved.
- **Mask and social distancing will be practiced based on local health department guidelines in camp to protect from COVID-19.**
- **Please be respectful of ALL volunteers & follow their directions.**
- **Make sure ALL parents and leaders know not to park in front of, besides, or enter District Executive's home.**
- **There will be NO onsite registration.**
- Each pack will have a round robin schedule to limit the number of participants in each area; please follow your schedule.

Check in Procedures:

All participating youth will receive a wristband at check-in. Check-in will be located in front of the bathhouse.

Wristbands **MUST ALWAYS BE WORN!** The color of the wrist band will coordinate with what event rotation your unit is on.

Vehicles WILL NOT be allowed to drive in campsites after 7:45 PM EST on Friday until Camp ends on Sunday. At 8:00 PM EST all vehicles must be parked in the parking lot. **PLEASE HELP US ENSURE EVERYONE KNOWS THIS.**

We will have 4 pull wagons available to help get item to your campsite. We encourage campers to bring their own pull wagons for ease of transportation.

T-shirts will be distributed to **Leaders Only** during leaders meeting Saturday morning (time and location will be announced on REMIND) then leaders will pass them out at campsites.

Camp Procedures:

- Promote good hygiene, wash, and sanitize hands regularly.
- No sharing of personal equipment such as water bottles (PLEASE make sure everyone brings their own).
- All surfaces and stations will be disinfected after each use.
- Social distancing will be practiced as much as possible.

First Aid:

- Each Pack should have a First Aid kit in campsites. There will also be first aid at rotations.
- Should an emergency arise that requires more, please immediately alert your Cubmaster and use best judgement if 911 is needed then alert camp chairman via REMIND.

Sleeping Arrangements:

- Please Space tents out.
- Only Families may share tents.

Cooking in Camp suggestions:

- Disinfect all surfaces & wash hands before, during & after cooking.
- Limit number of cooks.
- No self-serve lines.
- Servers need to have mask and gloves.
- No utensil sharing.

Scarecrow Rules and Ideas

- Scarecrows must be in good taste and Scout appropriate
- Scarecrows must be made to withstand weather conditions.
- Plastic bags, newspaper, packing peanuts make great stuffing.
- Facial expression of the scarecrow is important, and the first thing a viewer notices, be creative on how you display your creation.
- Hair can be made from a variety of materials, including yarn, pipe cleaners, shredded plastic, beads, moss, rope, raffia, a mop head, or torn fabric.
 - Accessories make the difference! Add hats, gloves, shoes, a scarfs and other fun props.
 - Suggestions for scarecrow head materials: old milk jugs, flowerpots, gourds, wood, basketball, plastic pumpkin, stuffed pillowcase, or burlap.
